

Message

Rasta is celebrating its 25th year or silver jubilee of its services to the underprivileged community. It was a long journey with lots of ups and downs filled with difficulties and memorable moments enthused with ever moving steps towards our vision and mission. Consequently, Rasta has educated over 23000 children and mainstreamed 7300 children, and trained 500 teachers of government schools so far. Vocational skills have been imparted to more than 1200 girls and women, and 340 girls have been adequately placed in profitable careers. 1.25 lakh migrants have been registered under our HIV/AIDS programme supported by the Government of Delhi. Rasta has also conducted five research studies for agencies like Save the Children-India, UNICEF etc. Our work was widely appreciated by govt. officer, corporate houses and media equally. The popular television channel like Doordarshan and NDTV. They gave special program for the activities of the organization.

We have touched upon the lives of 27000 people directly and 2 lakhs people indirectly in 78 locations of Delhi/NCR with a team of 123 committed staff and funding partners.

I left my home in 1978 in search of a job. It was quite uncommon for our family to do any job outside of my hometown. In 1979, I came across with one of my friends, who was a qualified basic teacher and was teaching children of construction workers. He was also searching for a government job simultaneously.

One day he asked me whether I would work for the children of construction workers. I was working in a small company in Karol Bagh at that time. I showed my willingness and he introduced me to Mobile Creche working for the children of construction workers. I started working with that NGO. Those days social worker was not an appreciated job. I found the work interesting and continued my association with that NGO for 8 years. By then I started considering this as my career. I joined Deepalaya, an upcoming NGO in West Delhi and worked in one of the child development projects supported by Plan International. This work enhanced my competency to plan and implement programmes aimed at the welfare and development of poor children. It was an eye opener for me to understand the importance of education in human development. I spent about 12 years in this field and became quite sensitive towards the needs of the underprivileged. Whenever I met children with begging bowls at traffic crossings, I used to discuss with my friends to find means and ways to do something for those children. I brought together my like-minded friends, discussed the matter in detail, and decided to form on organization to work with and for the poor, especially the children. Thus was born Rasta, with eight members. Rasta got registered as a charitable society, under the societies registration act, in 1994. Till 1999, Rasta worked in a small way with nominal contributions raised from our friends and well- wishers.

In December 1999 we got a small donation of Rs.12500 from IC Trust as a support for teachers' salary, which is still continuing. We began with 1 staff, 5 children, slowly increased to 25 and then 75 children in slum cluster called Rajiv Camp in east Delhi. One of the notable projects for the poor is the Day Care Centres we are running in Gurgaon for the children of construction workers,

Our great desire is to own a Rasta building fully furnished with all necessary modern amenities to conduct our school programme and stabilise our programmes initiated in 1994 so that no girl remain out of school in want of money in the catchment area.

I take this opportunity to thank all those who have helped us to accomplish whatever we have been able to including our funding partners, staff and above all, the people in our programme areas.

मैंने देखा है कि आज ज्यादातर इन्सान, अपने और अपनों के लिये बहुत कुछ करने की उधेड़ बुन में समाज को काफी पीछे छोड़ देता है मेरा मानना है कि जो सुकुन किसी और के लिये जीने में है या यों कहें कि दूसरे को अवसर प्रदान करने में है यदि कहीं स्वर्ग है तो वह है सामाजिक कार्यों में बढ़—चढ़ कर हिस्सा लेने में है।

रास्ता में जब खोड़ा स्कूल की बालिकाओं के प्रथम बैच ने दसवीं पास की थी तो मुझे लगा कि हमारी संस्थ्या रास्ता वास्तव में सही रास्ते पर चल रही है और हम समाज के इतने बड़े हिस्से को Cover नहीं कर सकते किन्तु अपना कुछ तो योगदान कर सकते है।

यदि में अपनी बात कहूँ तो मैं रास्ता से professionally की बजाय

emotionally ज्यादा जुड़ा महसूस करता हूँ। नये नये प्रकल्प मिलने में मुझे जितनी खुशी होती है कोई प्रकल्प समाप्त होने पर उससे कई गुनी पीड़ा होती है। जब भी कोई व्यक्ति रास्ता में जुड़ता है मैं उसकी मदद के लिये जितना मुझसे हो पाता है सबसे आगे रहता हूँ किन्तु जब कोई व्यक्ति किसी कारण भी कारण वश रास्ता से अपनी नौकरी छोडकर जाता है तो उसके विदाई समारोह में सामिल होने पर मैं हिचकिचाहट महसूस करता हूँ।

अपने समय की बात रखें तो 2000 से 2004 और 2007 से अब तक (तकरीबन 15 साल) में पैसा उतना भले ही अर्जित नहीं कर पाया किन्तु इस क्षेत्र में एक छोटी सी पहचान , सम्मान और इन्सान , काफी अर्जित करने पर अपने आप को गौरवान्वित अवश्य समझता हूँ।

कई बार मैं संस्था में ऐसे सभी कार्य करता हूँ जो मेरी Job Responsibilities में नहीं होते । या यों कहें कि बहुत सारे अन्य कार्यों को करके अपने Job Description के अर्न्तगत आने वाले कार्यों को करने के लिये समय निकालना पड़ता है तो वहाँ पर मुझे और भी अच्छा लगता है कि संस्था ने मुझमें यह Skill देखा होगा इसी लिये यह कार्य मुझे सोंपा गया है।

Employee Speaks



As my boss, my guiding light, Mr. Pant says, "I founded Rasta, but it's Vineeta who worked hard to shape it up". It has always been - his vision is my goal, my command.

My journey of Rasta began in 1999 when I migrated to Delhi from Bihar. I was its first employee and we sowed the seeds of change with a meager amount of Rs.12500 and 5 kids.

I started working with the marginalized children of Indira Camp, but Hasanpur took my inspiration to another level. I remember there was a group of children which was leaning towards drugs and was encouraging other children to join them. One day, I met an 11 year old child from the group. I took it upon myself to help him. Gradually, with proper love and care, I was able to pull him away from such habits. Now, he runs his own small business.

There is another case of a girl whom I picked up from the slums and put her in Rasta School. She completed her schooling and now drives a cab all around the capital.

We have worked with the conservative families of Khoda and pursued them to send their daughters to school. Today more than 900 girls attend Rasta School every day and it's a matter of immense happiness and fulfillment for us.

There are many such life-changing stories, where Rasta has been the catalyst.

Such experiences and accomplishments in Rasta have moulded my psyche and understanding of life and have shaped me as a person which I am today. Working with these kids is my true love and life as well.

Thank you Rasta.



Case 1 Gulafsha, preferably with her Sewing machine)

"Now I can support my family", says Gulafsha, an ex-trainee of Rasta Vocational Training Centre.

Gulafsha lives in Khureji Khas in a small rented house. She belongs to a family of seven members - her parents, three sisters and two brothers. Her father is self-employed as a welder. He is the only earning member in the family. Through Rasta community mobilizer, Gulafsha came to know about the ongoing vocational courses in Rasta. She enrolled herself in the Cutting and Tailoring course in 2014, and simultaneously studied for graduation. She successfully completed the 6 months' course. Gulafsha started securing orders for stitching from



her neighbors and started earning. Still, she used to come to the

Rasta Vocational Training Centre to enhance her skill. In 2015 Rasta offered her the post of Cutting& Tailoring instructor at the Vocational Training Centre from where she learnt stitching. She was drawing a salary of Rs. 7000/- per month and helping her father to meet the needs of the family. In 2017 she got married and settled in a new place where she started stitching clothes from home.

Gulafsha says "Thanks to Rasta for helping me to become independent and turning my dreams into reality. Now I can support my family."

Case 2 Sultana passed X after attending Rasta's Adult Education Classes!

Sultana resides at Khureji Khas. Hailing from a conservative Muslim family, she was never allowed to go to school especially by her grandfather. Sultana was married off at the young age of 15years to a man 35years old who also hailed from an equally conservative family. Sultana was forbidden to get out of the house and interacting with others. Rasta staff, during one of their community visits to the area, came in contact with her and heard her story. Sultana



told them about her desire to study. Rasta staff dialogued with her husband and parents-in-law and persuaded them to allow Sultana to attend Rasta's adult education classes. Sultana started coming to the adult education classes, and was quite regular and enthusiastic in studies. Rasta prepared her for the class 10th examination of NIOS which she passed. Now she is appearing for 12th class. She is presently working as a garments seller and earns Rs4000-5000/-. per month. Her earnings are a big help to the family and she has endeared herself to the entire family.

Case 3 Pushpa is a cab driver now and is earning well.

Pushpa, 24 years old, belongs to a family of seven members – her parents, 4 brothers and 1 sister. While in School, she attended the remedial classes conducted by Rasta. Due to the untimely death of her father she had to discontinue her studies after 10th. Right from school days, Pushpa had a desire to become a cab driver. She joined a 6 months training in self-defence and the cab driving. She did well in these courses and became a driver in 2017 and is presently earning Rs.8000/- to Rs.10,000/- a month. Later with the help of Rasta, Pushpa continued her studies till B.A. Her mother started working as domestic worker. One of her elder brothers is living in their village and other brothers do not have a any regular work. Hence Pushpa is the main earning member in the family. Confident and hardworking, she looks forward getting settled after settling her brothers.



Case 4 Sujoy, once a Rasta teacher, runs his own Learning Centres now!

Mr. Sujoy joined Rasta as a teacher at Indira camp in 1999. Since then, he has been rendering his service very happily and sincerely. In 2004, when Rasta had to discontinued its work in Indira Camp, due to some financial crisis, Sujoy decided to work independently, so that education of the children was not disrupted. Impressed with his dedication and commitment Rasta decided to support him. Rasta supported him with the infrastructure and he continues conducting his educational classes even now. He is earning Rs.10,000/- to Rs.12,000/- a month and sustaining his family. He has three daughters and one son and all are studying.

He is thankful to Rasta for supporting him in his time of need.

"Rasts' shows poor Muslim girls the path to education

Khoda (Uttar Fradesh); Ten years age, when three wemen walked into Shabnam's one-normed home here one afternoon, her sto- and seven-year-old daughters. Sans and Shalma, were school dropouts. They were attending a nearly madrassa as the family could not afford their school uniforms.

Eack then, Shabnam did not know that the visit by the three women would change the lives of her daughters.

They were teachers of Rasta, a newly-opened girls' school in the neighbourhood. They had only one request: "Please send your daughters to our school."

It is a request that has since brought hundreds of young Muslim girls into the fold of education.

In this "disease and orthor-infested village" on the edge of Delhi — as the local media once described it — with a large Muslim population and no girls-only school, Rasta's teachers went from door to door convincing generals to send their daughters to the school — which then charged only Rs 40 a month and growled free books and uniforms.

For Sans and Shaims, who joined in the same class despite the difference in their age, it was a decision that has paid off. "New they can read names of busses, government decuments, my daughters are eleverer than us," a beaming Shabnam told LANS outside har sharpt.

From a modest beginning, the school now beasts of around bee students (of whom yo per cent are Muslims), online classes, and a pass percentage of Sq per cent for Class X.

On a recent winter morning, ay girls sat on wooden benches and a chorus of "Yes, malam", "No malam" could be heard in the Grade X classroom, gainted a bright yellow and orange.

A decade after the joined the school, the readside bityant-sciller's doughter Sans – now 16 and her tracher's "best student" – will write her Class X casm in a couple of months and she decam of becoming a tracher one day. And she is clear that education has helped her "become independent".

Her sister, Shaima, who earned a "double gromotion", has moved on to another school nearby and is in Class XI today.

Seated next to Sana in her class are Saima, x8, and Rukatyya, x7 - both confident enough to articulate their dreams.

"I can talk to anyone now. I'm not afraid to go anywhere," asis Saima, while Rukshya believes that, because she is now educated, her children will be better off.

All three girls had dropped out of school and, like many others, were brought back to school by Rasta.

Though well-established now, Rasta had an accidental beginning
