
A Path Towards Development



Basti Ka Vidyalya (Community School)



Nearly half of the population Of Delhi is residing in slums and resettlement colonies as a result of continuous urbanisation and industrialization. Rajiv Camp is one of the colonies developed as a by product of the said development in NCT of Delhi.

This is a small colony situated on National Highway no. 24, inhabited by the poor and marginalized people migrated from different parts of the country. You can see small kids running for schooling every morning towards the community school. More than 100 children are attending different classes in the school. But the community had an entirely different scenario three years ago when the team of RASTA stepped in.

The people are poverty ridden struggling to meet both ends for years. Education had never been a priority of the people of this colony. Under the given circumstances RASTA stepped in the colony. The team of RASTA started working by initiating issues like sanitation, park development, health awareness, community organization and education of their children. But there was no place for starting educational activities for the kids. The people removed garbage from one place and started constructing the school. The government departments and police gave them a tough time. They never lost their patience and succeeded in their mission of constructing community school- a place for the community based initiatives and interaction. Now they are the proud owners of the center. This is one example of many collective actions taken by the people.


Women are the major reckoning power in the programs of RASTA. Following activities have been undertaken for women development:

Organization: Women have been mobilized and organized in different functional groups while initiating any community development initiatives. Regular interaction is maintained with the so developed groups.




Total Number of women 172 participating in different programs

Madam Vinita Jha is a very popular name in the project area of RASTA. She is usually seen talking with the women groups, supervising different program initiatives of the organization, visiting government and non-government departments, etc. She is a highly resourceful and powerful woman always fighting for one or the other cause of community development, especially for the deprived women.

Any one watching Madam Jha addressing big rallies, cannot easily understand the path she has traveled to reach the state. She was born in the state of Bihar and was not lucky to have love of her father for a long time. But her mother was determined to make her a person of worth. Vinita used to be a sharp child and did her Post Graduation and B Ed Degrees with good marks. She came to Delhi after her marriage.

She wanted to become a teacher. Alternatively she started tuition classes at home and also in the slums with 5 children. Vinita had determined to do something for the deprived section of the society, and became favorite of the people within a very short span of time while taking teaching the slum children. During the course she happened to meet the Secretary of RASTA and agreed to work with the organization. Her hard work was acknowledged by the higher authorities. She achieved highest position in the organization with her hard work within three years only. Madam Vinita Jha believes that every girl has potential and can achieve highest level of performance. Let's all find Vinita in every girl of the community.

WORKING CHILDREN

Both of the parents work to arrange two square meals for the family. Children are left at the mercy of Almighty or exploiting forces. The elder children usually look after the younger siblings. Children start working at a very tender age to supplement the family income. Girls work as domestic servants while boys works as cheap and silent laborers. The story of exploitation is multi-fold. Children develop undesirable habits harmful to them and the society at large. The RASTA initiated a community awareness campaign to educate the parents on the problem.

Lack of awareness, improper health habits and inaccessibility to the health facilities all lead to unhealthy living habits among the community people. Following activities were undertaken to ensure 'Health for All' in the area:

Awareness Raising: Drives (6), Street Plays (7), Rally (6), Corner meeting (35) and family contacts are amongst the major activities undertaken for awareness raising of the people.

Growth Monitoring: Children in 3-5 age group participated in the program.

Immunization: Neo-natal to 5 years of Children and pregnant Women participated in the program. It was done in the collaboration with the government mechanism.


Pulse Polio: The community people mobilized to take their wards in the Pulse Polio Program of the government.

Family Planning: Communication media used to educate the people on the issues related to family planning. 6 plays were organized for the purpose.

Free Medicine Distribution: Medicine was procured from government and non government sources and distributed to prevent the possibility of diseases like malaria, diarrhea, etc.

Environment Promotion: Sanitation drives, park improvement and sanitary groups formation, usage of government mechanism are the highlights of environment promotion campaign.

AIDS Awareness: Awareness camp and door to door contacts were held to prevent the people from the killer giant.
