

# **EDUCATION**

As in the previous years, education of the poor, especially girl children in he age group of 3 to 18 years, continued to be Rasta's focus. In 2018-19, 2,332 children were onthe rolls, studying under Pre-School, Formal School, Non Formal and Remedial Education for children studying in Government Schools. Of the 882 children who were in the Non Formal Education classes, 145 were mains treamed mostly in Government Schools and some in Private Schools. Thus the number of children educated by Rasta over the years went up to nearly 23,000. Apart from use of Teaching and Learning Materials developed by Rasta, introduction of Smart Classes - Technology based learning -was an innovation introduced in the teaching methodology. Various co-curricular activities were conducted for holistic development of children. Also events like Independence Day, Republic Day, Cultural events, National Girl Child Day were the major highlights of the year. Of these, 'National Girl Child Day' coinciding with Rasta's Silver Jubilee Celebrations, was an important event witnessed by representatives of Rasta's several supporting partners. Detailed write-up on this appears later.

### Rohini and her three siblings are now in Government School

12 years old Rohini is 3rd among 7 siblings. As her father is not doing any work, mother, working in households, is the sole bread-winner of the family. During a community survey, Rasta staff found Rohini playing with her siblings. Initial efforts to convince her father to enroll Rohini at Rasta learning centre did not yield any result. But persistenteffortsfructified, when her mother agreed to admit Rohini in Rasta Learning Centre. Rohini joined the Learning Centre at Barola in April 2017. After 7 months, she got admitted into Government School. She is very good in studies and active in extracurricular activities. In the last "Sports for Change" conducted at Noida by HCL Foundation, Rohini won third prize in Kabadi. Later, her three siblings also gotenrolledin Rasta Learning Centre. They also have been mainstreamed in Government Schools in age appropriate classes. All of them are coming to Rasta Centre for remedial education afterschool. Her family doesn't have any words to express their happiness at their children getting quality education.



### Apsara and her two siblings are now in Rasta School

10 years back Apsara's family migrated from Bihar in search of livelihood and came to Khora. She was the eldest among her seven siblings (three sisters & four brothers). Her father was doing embroidery work and mother worked as a house wife. He was the only earning member in the family. Arranging food for the family was a back-breaking struggle for him. Apsara used to see the children of her neighbors going to school and envied them. But poverty and sibling care was the barrier in front of her education. A turning point came in her life when Ms. Mudrika,



one of Rasta teachers, met her mother. During the discussion, Mudrika came to know that their children were not going to school. She motivated Apsara's mother to send Apsara to Rasta School. After several dialogues, her mother finally agreed and enrolled Apsara in Rasta School. After a few years, when it was difficult for her father to survive on his bare income, he sent back his wife and children to their village. As a result, her studies got discontinued. After 2 years they came back and settled in Khora. Apsara took readmission and her two more sisters got enrolled in Rasta School. Now Apsara is in 7<sup>th</sup> standard, Tarana is in 6<sup>th</sup> standard &Aysha in 1<sup>st</sup> standard

# "I want to go for higher studies; then only I can get good job", says Neetu

Neetu is the daughter of Mr. Lalu and Mrs Manju who live in a rented house in Lokpriya Vihar, Khora, with their 4 children. Neetu is studying in 3<sup>rd</sup> standard at Rasta School. Her father is a daily wage earner and mother is a domestic worker. Neetu and her siblings were not going to any school, as both father and motherwere working. Both sisters were managing household chore & taking care of younger brother in the absence of mother. She has one elder brother who discontinued his studies in 5<sup>th</sup>



standard, as he had to gor for work, due to poor financial condition of the family. One day, Rasta staff met Neetu when she was busy washing dishes. When asked about her studies, she replied that she as well as her siblings were not going to any school. Rasta Teachers managed to get some idea as to when she would be able to meet her parents, or at least the mother. Next day, teachers reached on time and met her mother. Rasta teachers explained about Rasta school where she can send both her daughters for studying. Initially she was not very positive, but after lot of discussion and motivation, Manju was willing to send both her daughters to Rasta School. Neetu was enrolled in 2<sup>nd</sup> class & her **elder sister** Ritu in 3<sup>rd</sup> class. Now they are coming regularly to school.



# Saniya and her three sisters have resumed their studies in Rasta School


Saniya is 11 year sold. Her father is a scrap dealer and mother a housewife. Saniya has four sisters and two younger brothers. During community survey, Rasta team mether mother. When Rasta staff asked her about her children's studies she said due to poor economic condition and absence of Government School close by, they were not able to educate their children. On



the other hand, when Saniya was asked, she said "I would love to go to school mam, because I want to be a teacher". Rasta staff explained the facilities which are provided in school. Finally her mother got convinced and enrolled Saniya along with her two sisters in Rasta School. When Saniya was in 3rd standard her father left the job, due some reason. It was difficult for the family to survive under that crisis. Their landlord also asked them to vacate the place due to pending arrears of rent. The family was shifted to their mother's place in Delhi for two years. One day when teachers went for the survey they met Saniya who was playing with children on road. She took teachers to her mother. During discussion her mother told they came back to Khora few days ago. After discussion with teachers she enrolled her four daughter sagainin Rasta School. Now Saniya is in 5th standard, elder sister is in 6th standard and the other two sisters are studying in 3th standard

### Abdul is now studying in Government School at Sarfabad

8 years old Abdul was residing in Gadaniya village with his parents. His father works as a laborer and mother is a domestic worker. He is the only child of his parents. Due to poor financial condition of family Abdul was not able to go to school. Abdul wanted to study but his family condition never allowed him to pursue his dream. Fortunately, he came in contact with Rasta staff during community mobilization. When asked about his schooling, he said that he was not going to any school but really wanted to study. After seeing his interest towards studies, Rasta staff met his parents and informed them about Rasta learning center. Staff shared with Abdul's parents their son's interest in studying. After a few rounds of motivation, Abdul's parents got ready to send their him to Rasta's Learning Center.



AbdulstartedcomingregularlytotheSarfabadcenter. Heusedtoparticipate in every activity and performed very well. After school time he remained at the Centre and read story book and did his class works. His deep interest and curiosity to learn helped him to get mainstreamed in a short time in Govt. School at Sarfabad in the month of May 2018. His dedication towards studies shown the result in school test where he scored 14 marks out of 15. His teachers are very happy with him. Now he comes to center for remedial classes. His father is extremely happy to see the performance of his son in School as well as in learning center. Father says "Thank you Rasta team for helping my son get into School".



# **HEALTH**

Under the Health promotion programme, preventive, promotive and curative health care services continue to be rendered. Specific activities in this regard are:

### **Health Camps**

- General Health check-up, Dental check up, Eye check-up, Special Immunisation;
- Growth Monitoring, Immunisation, Nutrition Education along with supply of nutritious food every day to children attending Rasta's School, Learning Centres and Day Care Centres;
- AIDS awareness and detection camps 25 camps in a month


A health camp was conducted in Mandwali during the month of September 2018. There came a person Ramesh (name changed) who was looking very weak and ill. While talking to him, we came to know that he was going through transitionstage AIDS. He was not able to work and discharge his daily routine. Earlier also, he was going to many doctors, but no improvement in his condition was seen. He was screened for HIV in our camp and found him positive. Without any delay, Rasta team repeatedly counselled him and as a result, he agreed to go to Integrated Counselling and Testing Centreand for Anti-Retrovial Therapy. From there, he started taking medicines and after 4 months when our team met him, he was looking much better. He started going for his work and was able to help his family. He is very grateful to Rasta team whose timely intervention helped him to recover.

# **WOMEN EMPOWERMENT**

The Mahila Panchayats provide an opportunity to women to speak frankly and fearlessly, when seeking interventions and arbitrations to resolve disputes. This year, Rasta joined hands with Delhi Commission for Women for implementing the Mahila Panchayat Programme, which is supported by Delhi Government. The programme was started only in February 2019 and during February and March, Rasta dealt with 82 cases. These cases were service related (securing Aadhar Card, Voter Identity Card, Birth Certificates etc) and addressing issues of domestic violence.

NATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY CELEBRATION

NGCD was celebrated in a grand scale on 24<sup>th</sup> January 2019 coinciding with Rsta completing 25 years of existence.. Apart from conducting a rally on 21<sup>st</sup> January, in which over 150 children participated, a cultural programme was organized at LTG Auditorium, Mandi House, New Delhi. Ms Nandini Singh, prominent Kathak Dancer was the Chief Guest. CEO of Max Foundation, one of Rasta's current supporters and several well wishers of Rasta graced the occasion. About 300 people participated. A play by Rasta students, film on rasta's 25 years, were other notable highlights of the celebration. Also a street play on corruption and swachbharat and a performance on dangers of plastic use, were conducted by Rasta students.
